Its mission is to assist park management in meeting the natural and cultural resource management objectives established for the park.

The organization is one of numerous Citizen Support Organizations (CSOs) sanctioned by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Recreation and Parks. CSOs play a critical role in the Florida Park Service by serving as a source of financial support for the many physical needs parks have that are not funded by the state. In addition, CSOs, like the Friends of Jonathan Dickinson State Park, Inc., provide support to parks through the development of volunteer associations, educational programs, special events, exhibits and publications. By becoming a member of the “Friends”, you will be contributing to the preservation and enhancement of one of the most significant and diverse natural systems remaining in South Florida.

Close to 11,500 acres of land and river await the visitor. Teeming with wildlife, the park offers outdoor enthusiasts a variety of recreational opportunities including canoeing, hiking, picnicking, cycling, camping and extensive nature study. The Loxahatchee River, Florida’s first federally designated “Wild and Scenic River”, winds its way through the park passing under a canopy of centuries-old cypress trees. With 15 plant communities, and a unique human history, the park preserves a large and diverse part of coastal Florida in a rapidly growing urbanized environment.

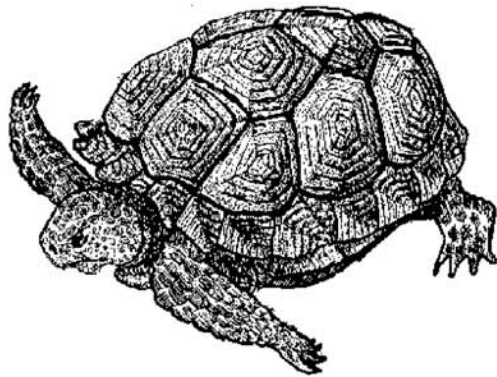
